Strategic Tribal Assessment and Review (STAR)

A tool to assist with strategic planning related to your Office on Violence Against Women grants

Instructions: Either independently or as a team, think critically about your project(s) and answer the following questions:

- <u>Strengths</u>: What strengths do we already have in place related to our proposed project? Ex: Culture, experienced staff, engaged community partners, secure funding, etc.
- <u>Obstacles</u>: What gaps must we focus on to reach our proposed goals? Ex: Challenges may include difficulty in hiring staff, need for updated Tribal codes, jurisdictional complexities, lack of community or leadership awareness about services, etc.
- <u>Opportunities</u>: What opportunities do we have when implementing this project? Ex: Increased staffing can lead to better community engagement and awareness of our services, improved relationships with community stakeholders (law enforcement, health services), etc.
- <u>Individual Challenges</u>: What individual challenges may we face as we work to implement our project? Ex: Staff burnout or turnover, increasing caseloads, competing grant priorities, etc. For each challenge, discuss potential approaches to mitigate these barriers.
