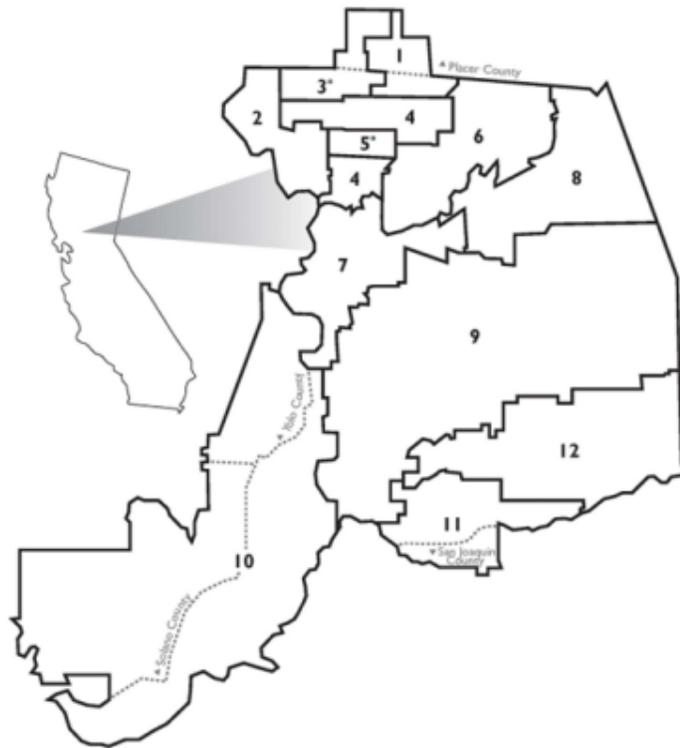

# Sacramento County LEA Overview

## Public School Districts Within Sacramento County



## Sacramento County Office of Education

- 13 School Districts
- 53 Charter Schools

## 2024-25 School Year

- **278,700** - Total Students Enrolled
- **16,417** - Students Identified as Homeless

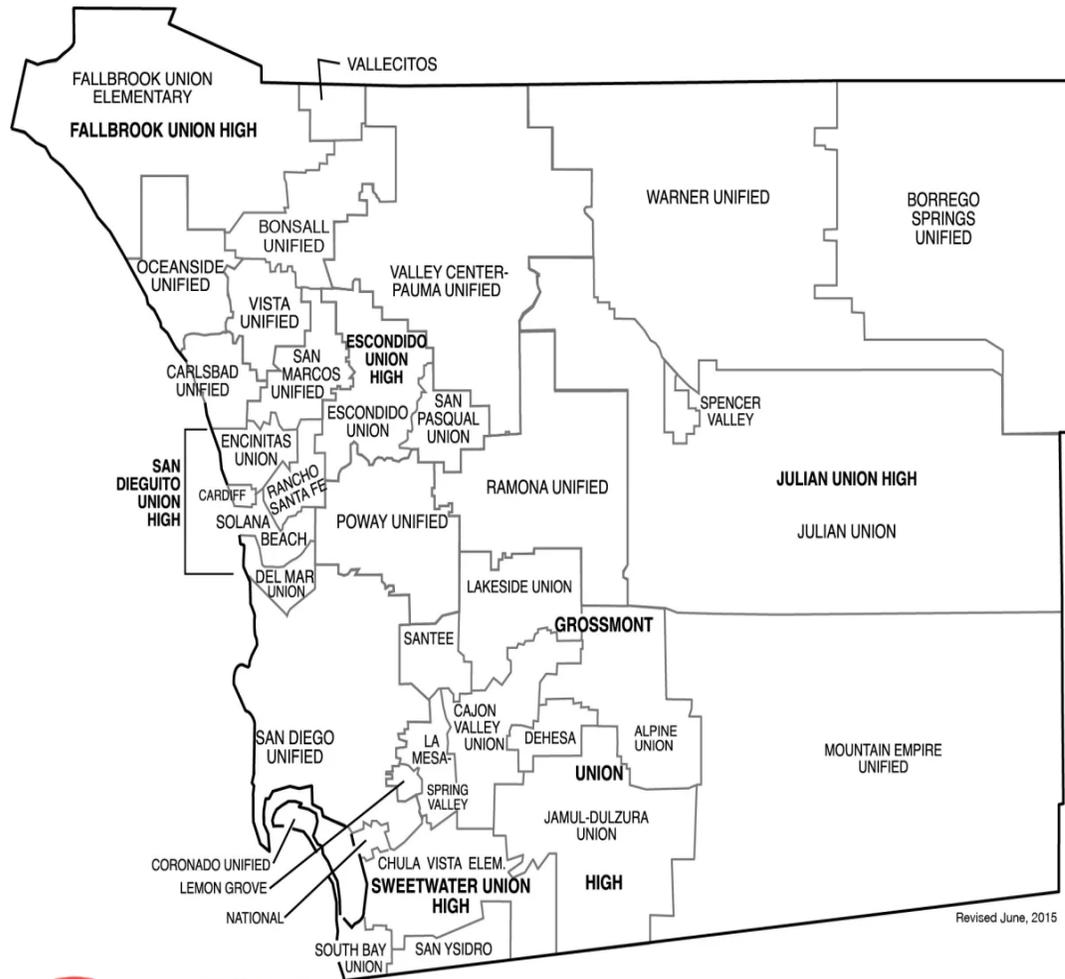


# Sacramento County Shelter System

- 60+ shelters in Sacramento County
- 13 programs focus on serving **families and youth**
  - 1 for men with children
  - 1 youth shelter (ages 12-17 only)



# San Diego County LEA Overview

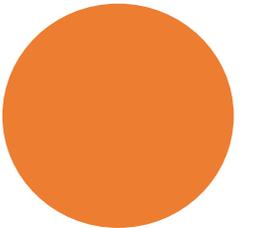


## San Diego County Office of Education

- 41 School Districts
- 120+ Charter Schools

## 2024-25 School Year

- 497,692 - Total Students Enrolled
- 24,739 - Students Identified as Homeless



# San Diego County Shelter System

- Around 30 shelters in San Diego County
- 1 shelter for Unaccompanied Youth
- Over 10% of San Diego residents live below the poverty line



# The Beginning



# STEP 1: Get a List!

**First, figure out the shelters in your area.**

Ideas:

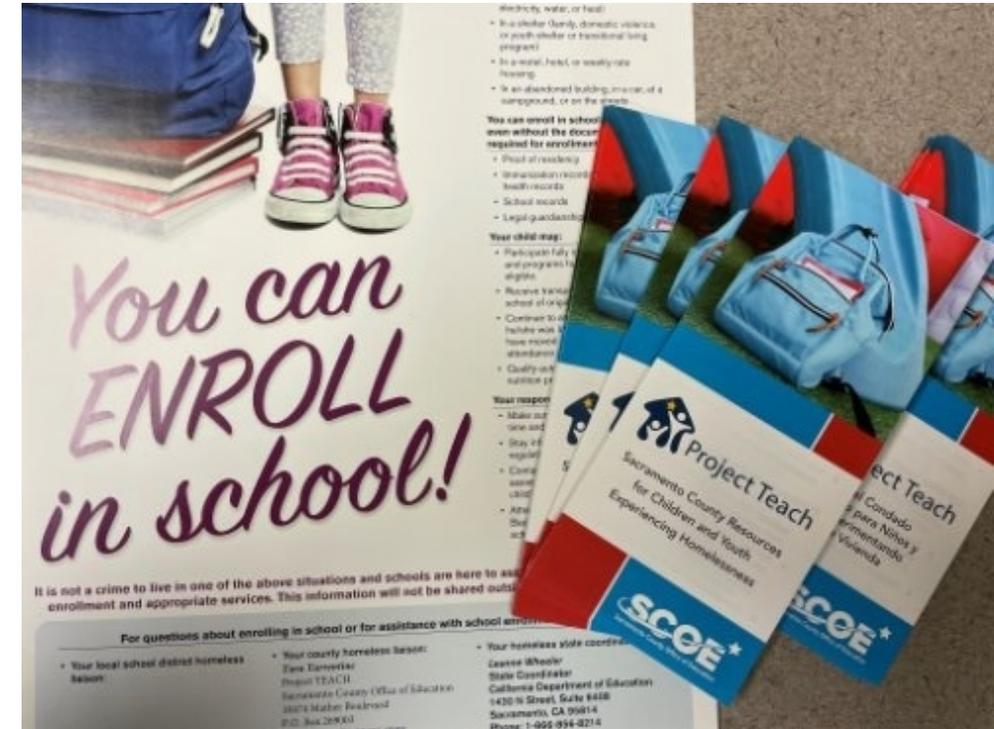
- Annual Point-in-Time (PIT) and Housing Inventory Count (HIC)
- 2-1-1 (if available)
- Ask LEAs/other staff what they know
- Use any other resources you may have



# STEP 2: Initiate Contact!

Next, start reaching out to shelters.

- Send emails, make phone calls, attend relevant meetings, etc.
- Ask for a tour and offer to share information about McKinney-Vento with staff and/or residents.
- Learn about their referral process, the criteria and details of their program, and what their greatest challenges are.
- Give materials.



# STEP 3: Develop Goals!

## Create goals for your program.

Sacramento COE's example:

1. To strengthen relationships between education and local shelters
2. To connect Homeless Liaisons and Early Education Advocates to local shelters
3. To ensure parenting residents know what their children's educational rights are under the McKinney-Vento law



# STEP 4: Maintain Contact!

## Relationships are key!

Ideas:

- Continuously offer **training** to shelter staff and residents
- Connect to **Homeless Liaisons and Early Childhood Education**
- Provide **resources**, including posters, brochures, and tangible items



# STEP 4: Maintain Contact! (cont'd)

## Create Community!

Ideas:

- Annual **Resource Fair**
- Schedule **enrollment days**
- Create a **shelter listserv**
  - for needs assessments, offering valuable resources, fall/summer baskets, creating a community, etc.

# Helpful Tips

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- Take Early Learning and liaisons with you after the first visit for personal connection and warm-handoffs
- Connection is constant—staff turnover happens a lot in housing programs, so try to have more than one contact
- Have tangible items—they're an excuse to visit shelters and get shelters to respond
- There may not be immediate engagement, but when the topic of education comes up your name will be at the forefront of their mind
- Remain grateful
